ZERO FATALITIES LEADERSHIP AWARD

The Zero Fatalities Leadership Award honors individuals for outstanding leadership that significantly improves highway safety to prevent traffic-related deaths and injuries. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S EXCELLENCE IN TRANSPORTATION SAFETY AWARD

This award is presented to a public or private transportation partner that has improved traffic safety. All levels of government and large or small organizations are eligible. The results may be from improved engineering or design, operational/management improvements to increase safety, increased public awareness or efforts to support an integrated comprehensive approach to improve safety. This award is presented by the Executive Director of the Utah Department of Transportation and is primarily designed to recognize partners working on the engineering and operations side of traffic safety.

COMMISSIONER'S EXCELLENCE IN TRAFFIC SAFETY AWARD

This award is presented to a law enforcement agency with a highly successful traffic safety program aimed at reducing death and injury on Utah's roadways. It recognizes and rewards an agency that works to not only enforce laws, but also to educate the public about occupant protection, impaired driving, speeding and other traffic issues. This award is presented by the Commissioner of the Utah Department of Public Safety.

OUTSTANDING TRAFFIC SAFETY PROGRAM AWARD

This award recognizes one project or subgrantee from the Utah Highway Safety Office (UHSO) and one from the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) from the previous fiscal year that has been successful in reducing traffic-related deaths and injuries. The projects selected to receive this award must have accomplished all the objectives of the grant, and also have made a positive impact on the community they serve. Recipients of this award are nominated and selected by UHSO and UDOT staff.
